REISEVERLAUF

TAG 1 Nach der Ankunft in Reykjavik werden wir mit einem von Aurora Expeditions organisierten Transfer zu unserem Gruppenhotel gebracht. Nachdem wir Informationen zum Ablauf des Einschiffungstags erhalten haben, steht uns der restliche Tag zur freien Verfügung.

2 Nach dem Frühstück beginnt unser Ausflug „Golden Circle“. Dieser beinhaltet die wichtigsten Sehenswürdigkeiten der Umgebung: Gullfoss Wasserfall, der Geysir und der geschichtsträchtige Thingvellir-Nationalpark. Später besuchen wir noch ein Ökodorf und kehren am Nachmittag nach Reykjavik zurück, um an Bord zu gehen.

3 In Arnarstapi werden wir von unseren Zodiacs an Land gebracht. Dieses auf der Halbinsel Snæfellsnes gelegene Gebiet zeichnet sich durch vielfältige Landschaften aus, die von Lavafeldern und glitzernden Fjorden geprägt sind. Gekrönt wird das Gebiet vom herrlichen, eisbedeckten Vulkan Snæfellsjökull. Wir können aus einer Reihe von Landausflügen wählen, die am besten zu unseren Interessen und unserem Fitnesslevel passen.

4 - 5 In den nächsten zwei Tagen erkunden wir die Region der Westfjorde, die durch ihre außergewöhnliche Landschaft besticht, mit atemberaubenden Ausblicken auf dramatische Fjorde, die von uralten Gletschern geformt wurden, steil ins Meer abfallende Tafelberge und eine unberührte nordatlantische Vegetation. In Patreksfjörður führt uns ein Landausflug mit dem Bus zu den Latrabjarg-Klippen. Als Europas größter Vogelfelsen ist Latrabjarg die Heimat von Millionen von Seevögeln wie Papageientauchern, Tordalks, Eissturmvögeln und Trottellummen. Außerdem können wir in Dynjandi einen der beeindruckendsten Wasserfälle Islands bestaunen.

6 Das malerische Akureyri ist Islands zweitgrößte Stadt außerhalb der Hauptstadt und verfügt ringsherum über eine herrliche schneebedeckte Bergkulisse. Wir besuchen die Wasserfälle Godafoss und Dettifoss und nehmen ein Bad in den Myvatn-Naturbädern. Am späten Nachmittag gehen wir in Husavik, der Walbeobachtungshauptstadt Islands, wieder an Bord unseres Schiffes.

7 Grímsey liegt etwa 40 km vom Festland entfernt und ist eine grüne, grasbewachsene Insel, die für ihre Nähe zum Polarkreis bekannt ist, denn dieser verläuft durch die Insel. Nachmittags verbringen wir einige Zeit damit, die Gewässer der Skjálfandi-Bucht bei Husavik zu befahren und hoffen, Wale beobachten zu können.

8 Wir machen einen Spaziergang durch das malerische Fischerdorf und schlendern dabei vorbei an bunten Holzhäusern, die noch aus der Zeit stammen als die Norweger dort siedelten und sich der Heringsfischerei widmeten. Wir haben die Gelegenheit, eine Wanderung zu unternehmen oder die Kunsthandwerksgeschäfte in der Stadt zu besuchen.

9 Djúpivogur, das Tor zum Vatnajökull-Nationalpark, ist die Heimat des größten Gletschers Europas. Wir fahren zur Gletscherlagune Jökulsárlón, eine Gletscherlagune mit schwimmenden Eisbergen, die ans Ufer gespült werden und am nahe gelegenen schwarzen Sandstrand, dem sogenannten Diamantstrand, glänzen. In Jökulsárlón haben wir die Wahl zwischen einem Bootsausflug auf der Lagune, einer Wanderung auf dem Gletscher oder einer Wanderung zu einer Schlucht, bei der wir mehrere Wasserfälle besuchen können.

10 Den Tag verbringen wir auf See und können die Annehmlichkeiten unseres Schiffes genießen.

11 Die Westmännerinseln liegen vor der Südküste Islands und sind vor etwa 10.000 Jahren durch Vulkanausbrüche entstanden. Wir fahren an der Insel Surtsey vorbei, welche zum UNESCO-Weltkulturerbe zählt. Die Westmännerinseln gelten als die größte Papageientaucher-Kolonie der Welt, und wenn man um die Inseln segelt, kann man zudem auch Wale und Robben beobachten. Auf der Hauptinsel Heimaey leben nur etwa 4.200 Menschen. Sie ist die einzige bewohnte Insel des Archipels.

12 Am Morgen erreichen wir den Hafen von Reykjavik. Nach dem Frühstück erfolgt die Ausschiffung. Transfer zum Flughafen Keflavik.

REISEVERLAUF

TAG 1 Anreise nach Reykjavik in Eigenregie. Organisierter Transfer von Aurora Expeditions zu unserem Gruppenhotel. Nachdem wir ausführlich über den weiteren Ablauf informiert wurden, steht uns der restliche Tag zur freien Verfügung und wir haben Zeit unsere Umgebung zu erkunden.

2 Nach dem Frühstück beginnt unser Ausflug „Golden Circle“. Dieser beinhaltet die wichtigsten Sehenswürdigkeiten der Umgebung: Gullfoss Wasserfall, der Geysir und der geschichtsträchtige Thingvellir-Nationalpark. Später besuchen wir noch ein Ökodorf und kehren am Nachmittag nach Reykjavik zurück, um an Bord zu gehen.

3 In Arnarstapi werden wir von unseren Zodiacs an Land gebracht. Dieses auf der Halbinsel Snaefellsnes gelegene Gebiet zeichnet sich durch vielfältige Landschaften aus, die von Lavafeldern und glitzernden Fjorden geprägt sind. 6 Wir erreichen Husavik, die Hauptstadt der Walbeobachtung. Wir besuchen die Wasserfälle Godafoss und Dettifoss und nehmen ein Bad in den Myvatn-Naturbädern. Am späten Nachmittag gehen wir im malerischen Akureyri wieder an Bord unseres Schiffes.

7 Siglufjörður ist die nördlichste Stadt auf dem isländischen Festland und ein historischer Fischerort, dessen Reichtum eng mit dem Erfolg der Fischereiindustrie verbunden ist. Es ist ein Gebiet von spektakulärer natürlicher Schönheit, umgeben von Bergen und einem Fjord. Am Morgen gehen wir mit unserem Expeditionsteam auf eine geführte Wanderung. Nach dem Mittagessen haben wir Zeit, die malerische Stadt auf eigene Faust zu erkunden und die zahlreichen Galerien, Museen, Handwerksbetriebe und die örtliche Kirche zu besuchen.

8 Auf der Insel Vigur können Vogelliebhaber eine Vielfalt von Seevögeln beobachten, während andere Spaziergänge und Wanderungen mit unterschiedlichem Schwierigkeitsgrad unternehmen und dabei die atemberaubende Umgebung genießen können.

9 Am Morgen erreichen wir den Hafen von Reykjavik. Nach dem Frühstück Ausschiffung und Transfer zum Flughafen Keflavik. Rückflug in Eigenregie.



ISLANDS WESTFJORDE UND DER NORDEN

MIT MS SYLVIA EARLE

Geologisch gesehen ist Island eines der jüngsten Länder der Erde. Es ist ein Land mit spektakulärer Geologie, das reich an Wildtieren, Kultur und menschlicher Geschichte ist. Auf dieser Reise erkunden wir die Westfjorde, eine der abgelegensten und ursprünglichsten Regionen Islands - ideal für Naturwanderungen und die Beobachtung von Vögeln und Walen. Wir entdecken abwechslungsreiche Landschaften mit tosenden Wasserfällen, dampfenden Lavafeldern und grünen Tälern, die sich bis zum Horizont erstrecken. In Husavik sollten wir die Augen offen und die Kameras bereit halten, um den Moment nicht zu verpassen, wenn ein Wal in unsere Nähe kommt. Papageitaucher sind in Island in großer Zahl anzutreffen. Wir werden viele Gelegenheiten haben, diese charismatischen Vögel beim Nisten in ihren Höhlen zu beobachten. Eine spannende Seereise mit der SYLVIA EARLE kann beginnen.

REISEVERLAUF

TAG 1 Nachdem wir den Flughafen von Toronto erreicht haben, checken wir in unserem Gruppenhotel in der Nähe des Flughafens ein und übernachten dort. Ein Vertreter von Aurora Expeditions informiert uns über den Tagesablauf des nächsten Tages.

2 Nach dem Frühstück Charterflug nach Nuuk, Grönland, wo unser Schiff MS SYLVIA EARLE wartet. Nach dem Einschiffen haben wir Zeit, uns einzurichten und am Abend das Expeditionsteam und die Besatzung kennenzulernen.

3 Sisimiut liegt etwa 54 Kilometer nördlich des Polarkreises, sodass man hier im Sommer die Mitternachtssonne erleben kann. Die Stadt ist berühmt für die alte blaue Kirche mit dem Tor aus Walknochen. In dem gemütlichen Museum neben der Kirche finden wir eine hervorragende Rekonstruktion eines Inuit-Torhauses sowie Exponate zur lokalen Geschichte und zum frühen Leben in Grönland.

4 Diese Region bringt einige der beeindruckendsten Eisberge der Arktis hervor. Wir wandern bis zum Eisfjord, der zum UNESCO-Weltnaturerbe gehört, und staunen über seine Unermesslichkeit. Der Sermeq Kujalleq, auch bekannt als Jakobshavn-Gletscher, ist der produktivste Gletscher - nicht nur in Grönland, sondern in der gesamten nördlichen Hemisphäre. Er produziert jeden Tag 20 Millionen Tonnen Eis, die in den Ilulissat-Eisfjord und die Diskobucht fließen.

5 Eine faszinierende Diskoinsel deren Inneres größtenteils gebirgig und vergletschert ist. An den Küsten verzaubern schwarze Sandstrände, ungewöhnliche Basaltsäulen, heiße Quellen und dramatische Lavaformationen.

6 Ein Tag auf See, bei dem wir die Annehmlichkeiten unseres Schiffes genießen können.

7 - 9 An der Ostküste von Baffin Island gibt es Buchten, die Futterplätze für Grönlandwale sind und wo Gletscher ins Meer kalben. Wir segeln durch Buchten und Fjorde, die von hoch aufragenden Bergen umgeben sind. Einige Orte

auf unserer Route: Home Bay, Sillem Island, John Ford-Fjord, Sam Ford Fjord und Scott Inlet. Bei geeigneten Bedingungen gehen wir in Pond Inlet an Land.

10 - 12 Wir hoffen, Dundas Harbour besuchen zu können, um Spaziergänge durch die hügelige Tundra zu unternehmen und vielleicht auch Vögel zu beobachten. Weitere mögliche Orte, die wir besuchen könnten, sind Croker Bay und Maxwell Bay. Auch wollen wir auf Beechey Island anlanden, eine der bedeutendsten arktischen Stätten Kanadas.

13 - 16 Unsere Optionen für die Tage hängen stark vom unvorhersehbaren Meereis ab. Bei geeigneten Bedingungen, Versuch der Überquerung der Bellot Strait, was uns die Möglichkeit gibt, durch den Prince Regent Sound zu segeln. Orte, die wir möglicherweise besuchen können: Prince Leopold Island, Port Leopold, Coningham Bay, King William Island.

17 - 22 Das erfahrene Expeditionsteam stellt die Reiseroute je nach Meereis- und Wetterbedingungen jeden Tag neu zusammen. Folgende Orte in der Region könnten wir besuchen: Cambridge Bay, Johansen Bay, Edinburgh Island, Jesse Harbour, Banks Island Smoking Hills, Franklin Bay.

23 - 25 Wir befahren die Beaufortsee. Der Kapitän unseres hochmodernen Schiffes navigiert durch Wasserstraßen, die die meiste Zeit des Jahres zugefroren sind. Dabei halten wir Ausschau nach Meerestieren, darunter Belugawale, die hier häufig zu sehen sind. In Prudhoe Bay fahren wir in die Vereinigten Staaten ein.

26 - 27 Westwärts nach Nome, entlang der Nordküste Alaskas. Wir hoffen auf die Erlaubnis, in der Nähe von Point Hope, Little Diomed und King Islands zu kreuzen.

28 In Nome verabschieden wir uns. Fahrt zum Flughafen, um mit einem Charterflug nach Anchorage zu fliegen. Übernachtung im Captain Cook Hotel (oder ähnlich).

29 Transfer zum Flughafen und Weiterreise in Eigenregie.

DURCHQUERUNG DER NORDWESTPASSAGE

MIT MS SYLVIA EARLE

Auf dieser Reise, die von Roald Amundsens historischer Expedition inspiriert ist, versuchen wir, die Nordwestpassage in ihrer gesamten Länge zu durchqueren. Wir bahnen uns einen Weg nach Westen durch das Labyrinth der Wasserstraßen, die die sagenumwobenen Inseln des arktischen Kanadas umschließen, bis wir die Beaufortsee erreichen. Wir besuchen historische Stätten, die von heldenhaften Entdeckern erforscht wurden, treffen die unglaublichen Menschen, die diese Region ihr Zuhause nennen, und suchen nach der rätselhaften Tierwelt, die in dieser einzigartigen Ecke der Welt zu Hause ist. Packeis kann unsere Reise durch die Passage unterbrechen. Dies wird eine echte Expedition, bei der das Abenteuer auf Schritt und Tritt auf uns wartet.

Svalbard in Depth

Svalbard Archipelago | 15 Days

On this extended exploration of the Svalbard archipelago, there is ample time to enjoy the best of this magical region, a world of near-endless daylight, where polar bear sightings quicken your pulse, guillemot cries echo from towering cliffs, and beluga whales rise from the sea. With extra time for exploration, we hope to show you some of our favourite places in Svalbard, and perhaps discover some new ones. Unpredictable conditions are expected in wild and remote places such as Svalbard, and with extra time, we can slow the pace of the voyage, linger longer in quiet bays to enjoy wildlife encounters and return to a landing that was previously not possible. Explore tundra adorned with wildflowers, keep watch for arctic fox, and discover historical camps of explorers and hunters. Push through pack ice to find walrus and bearded seals, and delight in the breathtakingly beautiful fjords.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Attempt to circumnavigate Svalbard, including Nordaustlandet, a polar desert rich in geological wonders and the most northerly point of the Svalbard archipelago
- Enjoy extra time for deeper expeditionary exploration
- Thrill in the anticipation of perhaps seeing polar bears on pack ice and other mesmerising wildlife, including walrus, seals, whales, reindeer and arctic fox
- Discover towering cliffs noisy with nesting guillemots and listen to the busy chanting of little auk colonies protected among the scree slopes
- Hike among tundra amid exceptional scenery
- Venture close to 80° north, watching out for polar bears and other wildlife on pack ice

Svalbard offers arctic wilderness at its best – phenomenal fjords, magnificent mountain ranges, and a polar desert rich in fossils, which set the stage for tales of early exploration. With extra time to explore the Svalbard archipelago, we have the opportunity to attempt a circumnavigation of Spitsbergen, if conditions allow. We may also explore Svalbard's second largest island, Nordaustlandet – a polar desert rich in geological wonders. Nordaustlandet features the most northerly point of the Svalbard archipelago (and Norway), is home to a large colony of walrus, and often frequented by polar bears. Stretch your legs on walks across tundra that is ablaze with wildflowers. In our trusty Zodiacs we visit towering cliffs noisy with nesting guillemots and puffins, and witness scree slopes that hold Svalbard's largest little auk colonies.
