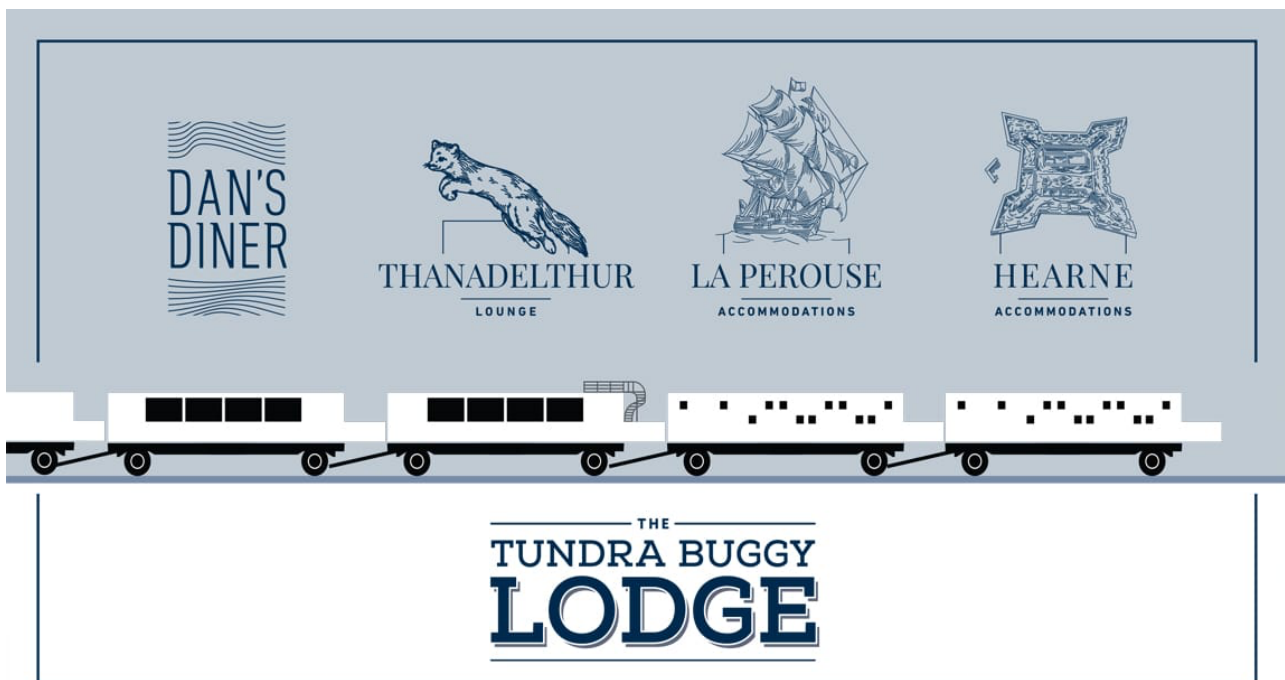

The Tundra Buggy Lodge

The Tundra Buggy® Lodge, located in the heart of polar bear country, offers a unique, immersive experience where guests can fall asleep and wake up with polar bears right outside their window and, on a clear night, the northern lights dance above, unhindered from the lights of town.

TUNDRA BUGGY LODGE AMENITIES



The Lodge consists of two accommodation units that can sleep up to 40 guests, a lounge, a dining hall, and staff quarters. Outdoor viewing platforms connect each unit and allow for outdoor photography. Situated far from the lights of town, the Tundra Buggy® Lodge is the perfect place to view bears all day long and have optimal northern lights viewing at night (weather permitting). The Lodge is also

equipped with exterior field lights that enable us to continue watching the bears even after the sun goes down!

ACCOMMODATIONS - HEARNE & LA PEROUSE





The accommodations, named Hearne and La Perouse after two important figures in Churchill's history, consist of 10 upper and 10 lower sleeping berths, each with a window, a reading light and four 110-volt electrical outlets. Each berth houses a standard twin-sized coil mattress 190 cm long by 98 cm wide (74.5 in long by 38.5 in wide).

A sound-dampening curtain provides privacy by separating the berths from the aisle. To combat the naturally arid conditions on the tundra, our accommodations are humidity controlled. As well, each berth is equipped with a thermostat controlled heating unit, giving guests the ability to adjust the berth temperature.

Bedding, towels, and even earplugs are provided for your comfort. In addition, each 20-person accommodation unit has three bathrooms, two of which are equipped with showers.

LOUNGE - THANADELTHUR



Our new lounge, named Thanadelthur after another important Churchill figure, was introduced into the Tundra Buggy Lodge fleet in 2016. It is used for relaxation, presentations, wildlife and northern lights viewing and more. Thanadelthur has WiFi accessibility, a multi-touch SmartBoard screen, and a robust audio system. Guests are invited to mingle over wine and appetizers before dinner, socialize, play cards or board games, and read. After dinner, enjoy presentations by the staff and wildlife experts who join us at the Lodge, including [leading researchers from Polar Bears International](#). Thanadelthur is also a great place to swap stories and share images.

Thanadelthur includes panoramic views from the wall-to-ceiling windows. It also has a roof-top observation deck for a 360° view of the tundra and wildlife or an unobstructed view of the northern lights.

DINING HALL - DAN'S DINER



Our Tundra Buggy Lodge dining hall, affectionately known as Dan's Diner, is where you will find our Lodge chef cooking up a storm of regional cuisine and hearty home-cooked favourites. Enjoy a filling breakfast to prepare for your day of wildlife

viewing on the tundra, and a delectable dinner with fellow guests to end off a successful day.

Breakfast may consist of hot and cold cereals, muffins, fruit, toast, pancakes or eggs. Lunch will be a picnic-style lunch of soup and sandwiches served on the Tundra Buggy. Dinner can include anything from chicken, to bison lasagna, fish or pasta and regional cuisines such as elk and arctic char. Coffee, tea, hot chocolate and juices are available throughout the day. Special dietary requirements can be accommodated at the lodge with prior notice.

The Tundra Buggy Lodge is seasonally positioned at Polar Bear Point in the Churchill Wildlife Management Area, home to the largest concentration of polar bears in the Churchill area. The Lodge offers a unique, immersive experience; at night, when conditions are right, you can view the dance of the northern lights from the rooftop observation deck and wake up to curious polar bears right outside your window in the morning.

Each day, you will be led on a Tundra Buggy excursion directly from your accommodations to explore the Churchill Wildlife Management Area to maximize your polar bear viewing opportunities. Evenings at the Lodge can be just as memorable, with delectable, regionally inspired dishes created by your private Lodge chef and ample time to swap stories with other guests and enjoy regional cuisine. As a guest at the Tundra Buggy Lodge, you are also invited to enjoy exclusive evening presentations hosted by [Polar Bears International](#) species experts.

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DAY 01

Welcome to Winnipeg

I flew into Winnipeg today and I am so excited for the Tundra Buggy Lodge! My home for the night is a Winnipeg hotel which is just across the street from the airport. After checking in, I head to an evening meet and greet held by our Frontiers North Interpretive Guide where our group has the chance to ask last minute questions and learn more about what our adventure holds!

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DAY 02

Churchill Adventure Begins

Today we are going to Churchill! After a very early breakfast with our Interpretive Guide at our hotel, our tour group boards a warm bus for the short ride to the private hangar from where our plane will depart for Churchill. The flight is two and a half hours.

Upon arrival, we head straight out on a Churchill and area tour, which comprises of an exploratory drive past various points of interest in and surrounding Churchill. Our driver stopped briefly at Manitoba Conservation's Polar Bear Holding Facility so we could get out and take photos. We take a break for lunch and enjoy a warm, home-cooked meal at one of Churchill's family-run restaurants – who knew Churchill had such incredible food?

After lunch we stop at Churchill's famous Itsanitaq Museum, which is home to an enormous collection of Inuit artifacts and has an incredible little gift shop where visitors can buy local Inuit art and carvings, books and other gifts.

In the evening we enjoy a wonderful dinner and a relaxing night in our hotel.

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DAY 03

Dog Sledding and Tundra Buggy Lodge

After breakfast, our first excursion of the day is a dog sledding program with local dog musher Dave Daley of Wapusk Adventures. Dave regales us with his incredible dog sledding stories, introduces us to his dog pack and then takes each of the group on a mile-long dog sled ride through the boreal forest. Next we head over to the Parks Canada Visitor Centre, which has in-depth displays that reveal the remarkable history of Churchill through wildlife dioramas and exhibits that portray the history of the fur trade in the area.

In the late afternoon we board the Frontiers North bus and head out to the Tundra Buggy Dock for our trip out to the Tundra Buggy Lodge in the CWMA. It's our first chance to see the incredible landscape of the North and it is absolutely breathtaking.

As the light begins to fade, we see the Tundra Buggy Lodge in the distance – it's almost as if we're approaching an isolated space station in the middle of nowhere. As we board the Tundra Buggy Lodge the feeling of isolation disappears.

The welcoming staff greets us warmly and we are treated to an incredible home cooked meal before settling in to our new home on the tundra.

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DAY 04

Tundra Buggy Adventure

After waking up in our comfortable accommodations, we gather for a hearty breakfast before boarding the Tundra Buggy in time for first light. We set out to explore the Churchill Wildlife Management Area (CWMA), in search of polar bears, arctic fox, ptarmigans and other incredible wildlife.

Our amazing Tundra Buggy Driver and Interpretive Guide teach us about the history and importance of the northern landscape. Midday we enjoy a picnic style lunch packed just for us by the lodge chef.

At the end of the day, we return to the Tundra Buggy Lodge in time for a delicious meal and a chance to relax in the lounge getting to know fellow travellers.

Tundra Buggy Adventure

Afterward we get to enjoy a presentation by a Polar Bears International representative about polar bears and Canada's North. We all head to bed early before our final day on the Tundra Buggy.

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DAY 06

Final Tundra Buggy Adventure

After a hearty breakfast, our group packs up and sets out on the Tundra Buggy for our last day on the tundra. We spend the day getting incredible photographs, enjoying our last Tundra Buggy lunch and take in the beauty of the North.

In the late afternoon our Tundra Buggy transfers us to the Tundra Buggy Dock, where we say good bye to our Tundra Buggy Driver and climb aboard the *Frontiers North* bus, which takes us back to the Churchill airport for the short flight to Winnipeg. They serve a light meal on board.

Once we arrive in Winnipeg, we are checked back into our hotel for our final night.

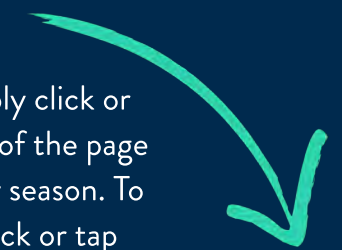

We begin by acknowledging that the land on which we host our tours is located on Treaty 5 territory, the traditional lands of the Cree, Dene, Inuit and the homeland of the Métis Nation. We honour their stewardship of this land, their cultures and their traditions.

We recognize that these lands were the site of significant historical and contemporary events, including the fur trade, exploration, colonization and the ongoing legacy of residential schools. We commit to working towards reconciliation and building meaningful relationships with the Indigenous communities of this region.

As we explore the natural wonders and cultural richness of Churchill and its surroundings, we remain mindful of our responsibility to care for this land and to uphold the principles of respect, reciprocity and reconciliation.





In 2021 we announced our decision to move away from using colonial themes in our visual identity. Accordingly, we removed a figure from our logo that we intended to represent our guest but could also hold negative connotations for Indigenous communities. We understand that this small action was the beginning of our Indigenous Reconciliation journey; introducing our new logo is just another step on our path.

The tree depicted in our new logo resembles a white spruce krummholz formation, commonly known as a flag tree, which is found along drier coastal areas near Churchill. These trees are subject to strong prevailing northwest winds which over time wear away the branches from one side of the tree. These trees are resilient to the harsh, subarctic climate and tend to have shared root systems with neighbouring trees allowing them to flourish.

The roots of the flag tree in our logo are intended to represent inclusivity and the stakeholders and rights-holders we consider in our business. Our guests, yes. And also our communities, the environment, our staff and Indigenous perspectives.

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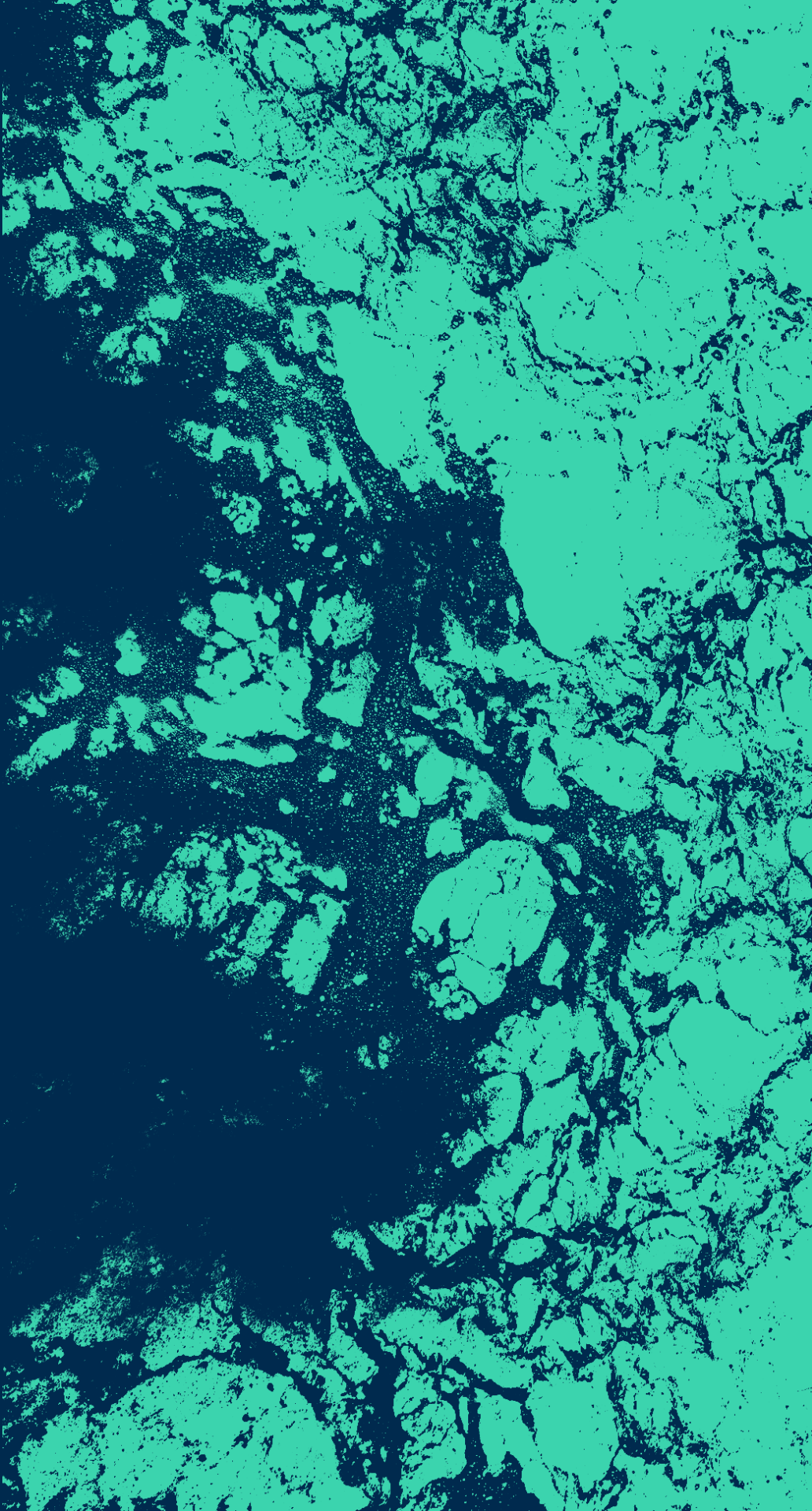

We at Frontiers North are committed to travelling sustainably in the areas where we operate. In 2023, we introduced a second operational electric-vehicle (EV) Tundra Buggy® to our fleet in Churchill. Successfully converting another one of our diesel-powered vehicles to electric-propulsion not only provides a less-intrusive, silent touring experience for our guests and wildlife, but will also reduce each vehicle’s operating emissions by approximately 99%! We are committed to reducing greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions and plan to convert our entire fleet of 12 Tundra Buggies from diesel- to electric-power by 2030. Following through with this initiative will reduce GHG emissions by more than an estimated 3,600 tonnes of carbon dioxide over 25 years.

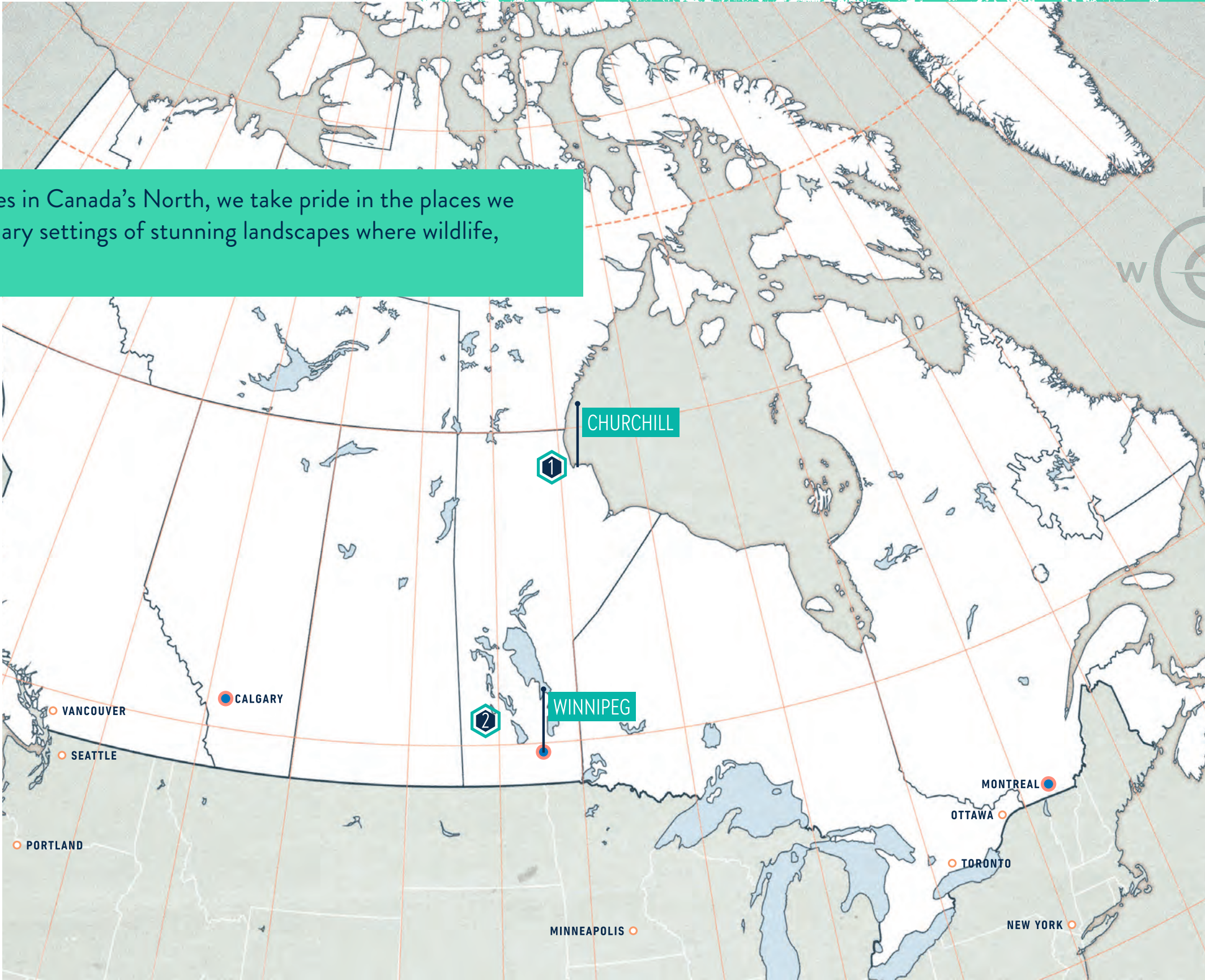

TUNDRA BUGGY ONE

Tundra Buggy One is a mobile broadcast and research centre we created exclusively for Polar Bears International's use. Tundra Buggy One is outfitted with tools and equipment that enable polar bear scientists to study bears and broadcast live webcasts and video from the remote tundra, sharing up-to-date information on Churchill's polar bears with audiences around the world.

TUNDRA CONNECTIONS®

Every fall, Polar Bears International conducts live, free broadcasts, webcasts and live chats, — from Tundra Buggy One during the polar bear migration in Churchill. Each week focuses on a different theme, tapping into the expertise of guest panelists. Viewers are able to see wild polar bears, meet experts, ask questions and receive answers in real time.

FIELD AMBASSADOR PROGRAM

Each year the Polar Bears International Field Ambassador program selects polar bear biologists and zoo professionals to join their team in Churchill. These volunteers donate two weeks each year for two years to share their knowledge about polar bears and climate change with tourists on board nearly 46 Tundra Buggy tours each year.

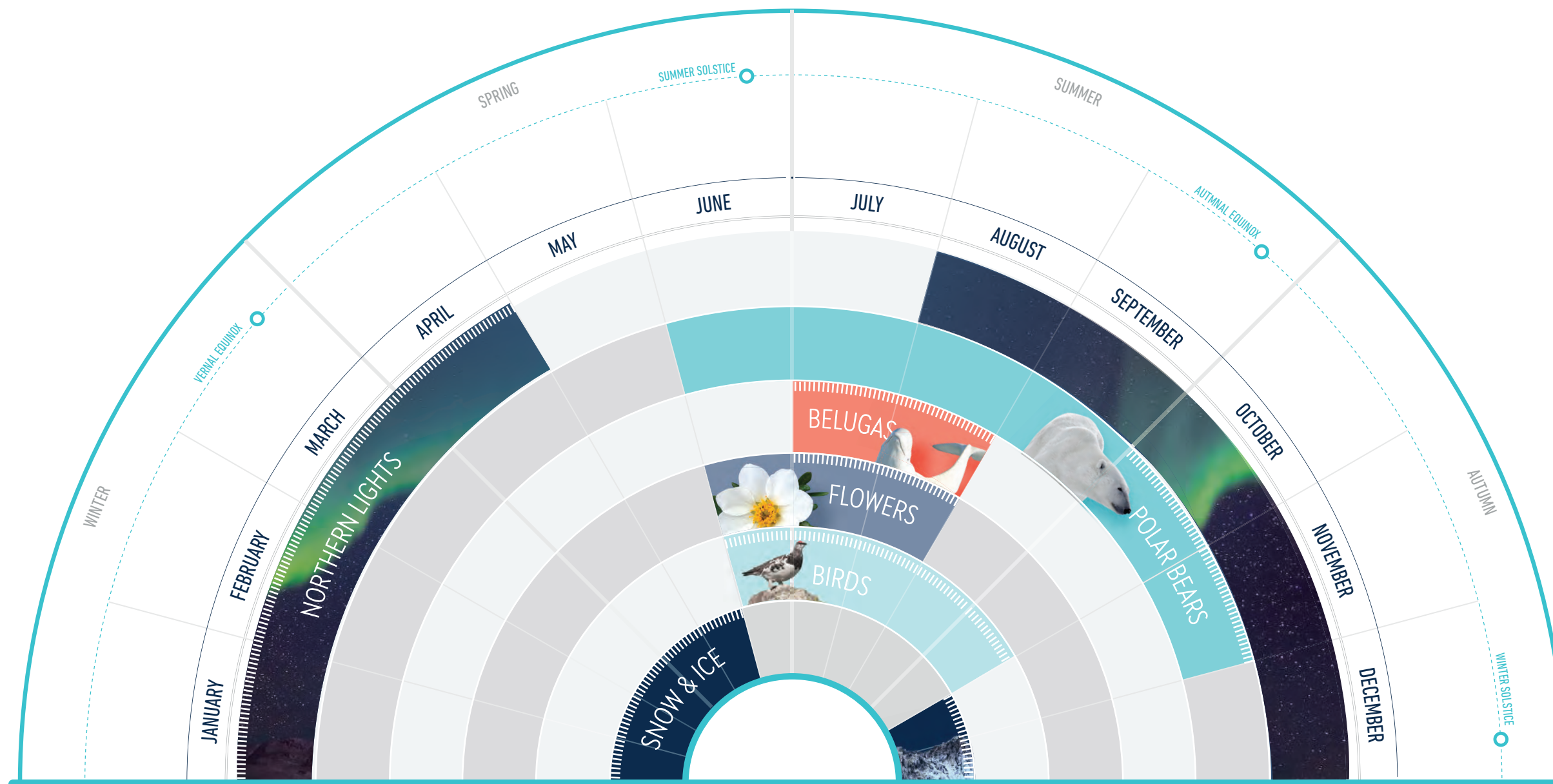
The Seasons of Churchill

You may know Churchill as the Polar Bear Capital of the World, but as the saying goes, great things come in threes! This remote community in northern Canada is also the Beluga Whale Capital of the World and is regarded as one of the top viewing locations to see the northern lights!

The best times to see Churchill's incredible wildlife and northern lights varies throughout the year. October and November provide the ideal environment to see polar bears roaming the wild tundra; July and August are the prime months to see beluga whales frolicking in the Churchill River; February and March provide the optimal conditions for viewing the northern lights, illuminating the vast night sky.

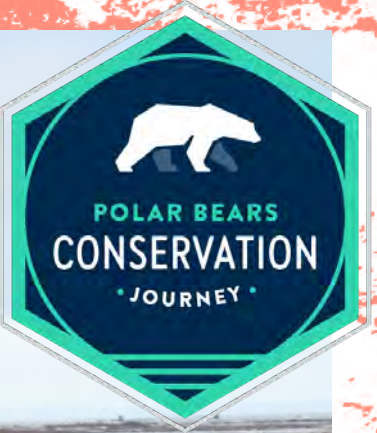

For example, how a changing climate is impacting polar bears, as well as our respective roles in Indigenous reconciliation and dealing with the scar tissue present as a result of colonialism. Heavy stuff on your 'trip of a lifetime', but we think you're up for it.

The idea here is that your time with us is meaningful. As opposed to just another notch on your travel belt, we want your experience with us in Churchill to represent an inflection point in your life; that over time you can look back and say, "Wow... that trip really affected me."
