ABOUT POLARQUEST

For 20 years, we have taken adventurous travellers to the Arctic archipelago of Svalbard. From May to September, our three small expedition ships explore this magnificent wilderness that are home to animals such as the charming walrus, the cute Arctic fox, the endemic Svalbard reindeer and last, but certainly not least, the king of the Arctic – the polar bear. Every expedition with PolarQuest is unique and our aim is that each passenger will have the trip of a lifetime. Sustainability is at the heart of PolarQuest and all trips are climate compensated.

A JOURNEY TOWARDS A SUSTAINABLE WORLD

Sustainability is at the heart of everything PolarQuest does. We travel in small groups and strive to have minimal impact on the environment. Our ships take 12 or 53 passengers and if you ask us, these small expedition ships is the best way to explore the wildlife and nature of Svalbard. Imagine, viewing a walrus on an ice floe in a group of 10 - 50 passengers, or to do so in a group of 250 - 500 passengers! Travelling on a small expedition ship also offers a more relaxed atmosphere, greater focus on the destination and more time ashore, compared to travelling on board a larger ship.

WE CARBON OFFSET ALL OUR TRIPS

As operators of expedition cruises, we cannot avoid emitting greenhouse gases during a voyage. Until renewable fuels are available in our line of business, we have chosen to climate compensate (carbon offset) all our trips. Our goal is to overcompensate and be climate positive every year, to slowly pay back to mother earth for emissions made back in time.

PolarQuest is one of the eight companies that founded the Association of Arctic Expeditions Cruise Operators (AECO) in 2003, to regulate tourism in Svalbard and promote sustainable, environmentally friendly and safe tourism in the area. The organization strives to conduct expeditions with the utmost respect for nature and wildlife. One part in this is carefully developed guidelines that all members are to follow during cruises and landings. Today, AECO is a respected representative for the cruise industry and a leading star for operators who wish to conduct responsible tourism in the Arctic.

Svalbard is home to charming walruses, cute Arctic foxes, endemic Svalbard reindeers and in the surrounding waters we have good chances of spotting several different kinds of whales. Last, but certainly not least, we hope to encounter the magnificent polar bear - the king of the Arctic!

THE SVALBARD SEASONS

MAY & JUNE

- ► The beginning of the season is characterised by snow and a wonderful purity.
- ► It is still spring in the Arctic, polar bears and seals can be seen on the

- summer nests and the bird cliffs are teeming with life.

JULY

- ► Summer arrives in July.
- ► Experience the midnight sun.
- ▶ The ice thaws around the islands and this makes it possible to get further east.
- ▶ More areas become snow-free and more accessible for hikes.
- ▶ Bird cliffs are teeming with life.
- ► The Arctic flowers are in bloom.
- ► Whales are more frequently seen.



AUGUST & SEPTEMBER

- Greater chance to explore the eastern part (including White Island) or to complete a circumnavigation of Spitsbergen.
- Autumn arrives in late August and this is when the snow-free landscape is most visible.
- ▶ The tundra is shifting in autumn colours.
- From late August, the sun starts to set, offering wonderful red and pink skies.
- ▶ For the keen photographer September offers a warm and soft light.
- Female walruses with cubs are not an uncommon sight.



M/S QUEST

M/S Quest (formerly Sea Endurance) was built in Denmark in 1992 to serve as a ferry on Greenland's west coast. In 2004/2005 she was completely refurbished into a comfortable expedition ship and in 2018 she underwent a renovation of the passenger areas. M/S Quest takes 53 passengers and all 26 cabins are outside cabins with private facilities. In the dining room you are treated to breakfast, lunch and dinner and in the panorama lounge you can enjoy coffee or tea with a breathtaking view of the surrounding landscape. Here you can also listen to entertaining talks on Svalbard's flora, fauna and history. In the lounge you also find a bar and a small library.

M/S STOCKHOLM

The M/S Stockholm is a classic ship built in 1953 for the Swedish National Maritime Administration. In 1999 she was totally refitted and started her career as a comfortable polar passenger ship. The M/S Stockholm carries a maximum of 12 passengers in twin cabins with bunk beds. All cabins have private facilities and small windows (portholes). M/S Stockholm is a marvellous piece of maritime history with beautiful brass details and wooden decks. After 20 years in Svalbard she has the experience and track record of being able to reach sites that are inaccessible to other ships.

M/S SJØVEIEN

M/S Sjøveien (meaning the Seaway) was built in Bergen in 1964 for the Norwegian Government. After being a hotel ship for the past few years, she has now been refurbished into a classic and exclusive passenger ship and started her career in Svalbard in 2017. To accommodate a maximum of 12 passengers there are eight outside cabins, all with private facilities. She is a true beauty with wooden decks and vintage details. The dining and lounge area is found on main deck. There is a lot of deck space on the main deck and there is also an excellent area on top of the bridge.

RESERVATION

A non-refundable deposit of 20% of the expedition price, along with a completed and signed PolarQuest booking form will reserve the berth/berths. The balance of the expedition price is due 90 days prior to departure.

INFORMATION TO AND FROM GUESTS

All travellers are provided with personal log in details to access the webpage "My bookings", which contains pre departure information including an equipment checklist, information about the ship and more. Here, all travellers also submit their personal information such as passport details, insurance details, dietary restrictions etc.

The final documents for each trip are sent out 3-4 weeks prior to departure. They will not be sent until final payment and all information from travellers (i.e. booking form and personal information) have been received. The final documents include a book, a map of Svalbard, contact information and a cover letter with travel instructions. (Flight tickets will also be enclosed if they have been booked through PolarQuest).

Spitzbergen im arktischen Frühsommer erleben

Das kleine Expeditionsschiff QUEST bringt Sie an einige der schönsten Küsten im Norden und Westen von Spitzbergen. Und dies im arktischen Frühsommer, einer besonders lohnenden Zeit, um die arktische Wildnis Spitzbergens zu erleben.

Ab Mitte April wird es in der Nacht in Spitzbergen nicht mehr dunkel. Nach der langen Polarnacht **ist das Licht zurückgekehrt** und im Mai und Juni erwacht das arktische Leben. Aufgrund der steigenden Temperaturen ziehen sich das **Meereis** und die Schneefelder langsam zurück.

Trotzdem hält zu dieser Zeit das Meereis die Seegebiete um Spitzbergen oft noch "in seinem Griff" und an den Küsten (vor allem im Norden und Osten des Archipels) sind vielfach noch die sich ständig ändernden **Eisformationen des Meereises** zu bewundern. Daher gilt für diese Übergangszeit zum arktischen Sommer in besonderem Maße, dass geplante Routen und Aktivitäten mit viel **Flexibilität** zu betrachten sind und Naturkreuzfahrten zu dieser Jahreszeit haben in ganz besonderem Maße den **Charakter (und den Reiz) einer Expedition**.

Die Tierwelt der Arktis erleben

Natürlich stehen auch bei dieser **Spitzbergen** Reise mit dem **Expeditionsschiff QUEST Tierbeobachtungen** im Zentrum der Reise. Und dies sehr zu recht – hat doch Spitzbergen ein für arktische Verhältnisse sehr reiches Tierleben, wofür der Nährstoffreichtum des Nordpolarmeeres verantwortlich ist. **Robben, Walrosse, Buckel- und Finnwale** können mit etwas Glück beobachtet werden. Und natürlich hoffen wir auch Eisbären während unserer Spitzbergen Naturkreuzfahrt zu beobachten. Ein wahres Highlight dem weißen Riesen in seinem natürlichen Lebensraum zu begegnen!

Platz bietet die QUEST für maximal 53 Passagiere in 26 Außenkabinen, die alle über ein Fenster verfügen. Ein gut **überschaubares Expeditionsschiff** – mit einer intensiven Betreuung seitens der Crew und der begleitenden Guides.

Während dieser Spitzbergen Naturkreuzfahrt sind täglich Exkursionen geplant. Hierfür nutzen wir Zodiacs, auf denen Sie zu den schönsten Küstenzonen gelangen und dort bei den Anlandungen die nordische Landschaft zu Fuß erkunden.

Zurück an Bord der QUEST bietet sich ein Besuch der schönen **Panorama Lounge** an, von der aus Sie bei einem stärkenden Heißgetränk beste Aussichten auf Küsten, Eisberge und die Tierwelt von Spitzbergen geniessen.

Fazit: Eine kompakte und aufgrund der Reisezeit besonders spannende Spitzbergen Naturkreuzfahrt.

Tag 1: Anreise nach Oslo

Heute fliegen Sie von Ihrem Heimatflughafen in Deutschland, der Schweiz oder Österreich nach **Oslo**. Hier angekommen übernachten Sie im Radisson BLU Airport Hotel direkt am Flughafen in Oslo.

Tag 2: Weiterflug nach Spitzbergen

Am Morgen Weiterflug von Oslo nach Longyearbyen, dem Hauptort von Spitzbergen. Hier werden Sie am Flughafen erwartet und zu Ihrem Hotel in Longyearbyen gebracht. Nach dem Zimmerbezug bleibt am Nachmittag noch Zeit die **nordische "Metropole" Longyearbyen** zu erkunden. Einstmals eine Bergbausiedlung ist Longyearbyen heute vor allem Sitz von Verwaltung und diverser Forschungsinstitute. Sie können sich im Ortskern von Longyearbyen frei bewegen und sich bei einem Spaziergang einen ersten Eindruck von Ort und der umgebenden Landschaft verschaffen. Übernachtung im Hotel in Longyearbyen.



Tage 3 – 9: Expedition Spitzbergen im arktischen Frühsommer

Am Morgen bleibt nochmals ein wenig Zeit für Longyearbyen. Am Nachmittag schiffen wir uns auf dem **Expeditionsschiff QUEST** ein, die dann in den **Isfjord** ausläuft.

Die exakte Route der Reise mit der QUEST liegt nicht fest, da in den Seegebieten um Spitzbergen **unsere Route sehr stark von den aktuellen Eis- und Wetterbedingungen abhängig ist**. Natürlich passen wir unsere Reiseroute flexibel an die sich ergebenden Möglichkeiten für Tierbeobachtungen an. Geplant sind tägliche Anlandungen und /oder Ausflüge mit den Zodiacs.

Folgende Orte könnten mögliche Anlandeplätze der Nord-West Spitzbergen Kreuzfahrt sein:

Im **Krossfjorden** erwarten uns wunderschöne Landschaftsbilder mit Gletschern und Bergspitzen. Hier können wir mit unseren Zodiacs nah an die hoch aufragende **Gletscherfront des 14.-Juli-Gletschers** heran fahren. Auf den grünen Hängen des Fjords blühen arktische Pflanzen und auf den Klippen haben **Dreizehenmöwen** und **Dickschnabellummen** ihre Rast-und Brutplätze.

Mit Ny Ålesund besuchen wir die nördlichste permanent bewohnte Stadt der Welt. Hier finden sich zahlreiche Forschungsinstitute sowie der berühmte Anker-Mast des lenkbaren Luftschiffes Norge, in dem Amundsen, Nobile und Ellsworth der erste Flug über den Nordpol nach Nome (Alaska) im Jahr 1926 glückte.

Nord Spitzbergen – in den Raudfjord und Erkundungen am Packeis

Der schöne **Raudfjord** liegt an der Nordwestküste Spitzbergens. In der von Gletschern dominierten Landschaft lassen sich oft **Bart- und Ringelrobben** sehen und **Eisbären** werden hier häufig gesichtet. Aufgrund der geografischen Lage findet sich in den weiter nördlich gelegenen Gewässern zu dieser Zeit häufig noch **Meereis**. Auf unseren Fahrten mit den Zodiacs nähern wir uns dem Eis und genießen die Stille und Weite der Eislandschaft in Nord Spitzbergen. Außerdem bestehen am und auf dem **Meereis** gute Chancen für die Beobachtung von **Eisbären**.

Später laufen wir den Liefdefjord an und nähern uns hier der 5 Kilometer langen Front des Monaco Gletschers. Entlang der Abbruchkante des Gletschers lassen sich häufig Tausende von Dreizehenmöwen beobachten und auch Eisbär-Sichtungen sind hier nicht selten.

West Spitzbergen – Prins Karls Forland

Der Anblick dieser großen, aber recht schmalen Insel wird von einer prächtigen und schneebedeckten Bergkette geprägt. Die Insel ist auch Heimat vieler Seevögel und Seehunde. Weiterhin finden sich an einigen Stränden dieser Insel **Ruheplätze von Walrossen**. Bei günstigen Wetterbedingungen können wir uns den großen Robben mit den Zodiacs nähern und die eindrucksvollen Tiere aus der Nähe beobachten.



Ein möglicher Abstecher in den Süden – Erkundung des Hornsunds

Der große Fjord im Südwesten von Spitzbergen bietet mit seinen hohen, vergletscherten Bergen eine atemberaubend schöne Landschaft. Bei klarer Sicht können wir den Gipfel des

Hornsundtind (1.431m) sehen. Vor allem aber münden mehrere große Gletscher in den Sund und schieben kontinuierlich Eismassen ins Meer, die dann als Eisberge ihre Reise ins Nordpolarmeer aufnehmen.

Tag 10: Flug von Longyearbyen nach Oslo

Am gestrigen Abend oder in der Nacht ist die QUEST wieder in den Hafen von Longyearbyen eingelaufen, wo wir die letzte Nacht an Bord unseres Expeditionsschiffes verbracht haben.

Am frühen Morgen verlassen wir die QUEST und werden zum Flughafen von Longyearbyen gebracht und beginnen unsere **Heimreise**. Der Rückflug bringt uns nach Oslo, wo flugplanbedingt in der Regel nochmals eine Hotelübernachtung eingeplant ist.

Tag 11: Flug von Oslo zum Heimatflughafen

Am Morgen treten Sie den Rückflug zu Ihrem Heimatflughafen an, wo mit der Ankunft dieses Spitzbergen Reiseprgramm endet.



Das Expeditionsschiff MS QUEST

Die **QUEST** wurde 1992 in Dänemark als Fähre unter dem Namen SAQQIT ITTUK für den Einsatz an der grönländischen Westküste gebaut. 2004/2005 wurde sie komplett zu einem **komfortablen Expeditionsschiff** umgebaut und 2018 einer Renovierung der Passagierbereiche unterzogen. Heute bietet das Schiff Platz für **53 Passagiere**.


Über dem Brückendeck befindet sich eine verglaste **Panorama-Lounge**, von der Sie einen hervorragenden **270° Ausblick** auf die eindrucksvolle arktische Szenerie haben. Auf der **offenen Brücke** sind Sie sehr willkommen und können dem Kapitän und den Offizieren beim Navigieren "über die Schulter" zu sehen. Das Expeditionsteam der QUEST, bestehend aus wissenschaftlichen Lektoren und ortskundigen Reiseleitern, vermittelt Ihnen bei Vorträgen und Exkursionen Interessantes und Wissenswertes über Land und Leute sowie über die Fauna und Flora der Arktis.


Aufgrund ihres geringen Tiefgangs von nur 3,5 m kann die QUEST auch solche Buchten und Fjorde befahren, die für größere Kreuzfahrtschiffe unerreichbar sind.

Zur **Eisklasse** ist folgendes zu sagen: da es sich um einen Zweckbau für die grönländischen Küstengewässer handelt, wurde besonderer **Wert auf die passive Sicherheit durch einen sehr stabilen Rumpf** gelegt. Dieser wurde nach den Vorgaben der Eisklasse A1A konstruiert. Für die Gesamteisklasse ist aber auch die Maschinenleistung maßgeblich und die wurde – für die Küstenschifffahrt üblich – auf niedrigen Verbrauch optimiert. Daher ist die Gesamteisklasse "nur" bei A1B. Es handelt sich also um ein **sparsames Schiff** mit **äußerst stabilem Rumpf**!

Alle **26 Kabinen** sind **Außenkabinen** mit eigenem Bad und **Fenster**. In jeder Kabine findet sich ein Schreibtisch mit Stuhl und ein Schrank zur Aufbewahrung. Die Kabinen verfügen über ausreichend Staumöglichkeiten für Kleidung und Ausrüstung während der Reise. Stromanschluss in allen Kabinen: Euro-Stecker mit 220 V.



Im arktischen Sommer unternehmen wir eine Spitzbergen Umrundung mit dem Expeditionsschiff QUEST. In dieser Jahreszeit schrumpft die Ausdehnung des Meereises in den Seegebieten um Spitzbergen und lange vom Eis verschlossene Regionen im Norden und Nordosten Spitzbergen werden wieder zugänglich.

Bei dieser Naturkreuzfahrt mit dem Expeditionsschiff QUEST planen wir eine Umrundung des Spitzbergen Archipels und werden dabei auch die Fjorde weit im Norden und die Inseln im Nordosten des Svalbard Archipels erkunden.

Nach der Fluganreise nach Spitzbergen und einer Übernachtung in Longyearbyen erleben Sie bei einer **11 tägigen Kreuzfahrt** Spitzbergen intensiv – als Teil einer Gruppe von **maximal 53 Reisenden**.

Ein Reiseziel bei unserer Spitzbergen Umrundung mit dem Expeditionsschiff QUEST wird im Nordwesten u.a. der schöne Liefdefjord mit dem gewaltigen Monaco Gletscher sein. Wenn es die Eisbedingungen erlauben, planen wir in die Hinlopenstraße einzulaufen und den beeindruckenden Vogelfelsen Alkefjellet zu besuchen.

Im Südosten Spitzbergens bieten die großen Inseln **Barentsøya** und **Edgeøya** spektakuläre Landschaften und Sie haben gute Chancen **Walrosse**. Polarfüchse und Spitzbergen-Rentiere zu beobachten.

Ein letztes Highlight der Spitzbergen Umrundung mit dem Expeditionsschiff QUEST ist der im Südwesten des Archipels gelegene Hornsund. Die eindrucksvolle Landschaft wird von den höchsten Bergen Spitzbergens und gewaltigen Gletschern dominiert, die hier ihre Eismassen ins Meer entlassen. Nicht selten werden hier **Eisbären** gesichtet.

An Bord des kleinen Expeditionsschiffes QUEST reisen Sie mit Komfort und haben – gerade auch wegen der geringen Gruppengröße – viel Gelegenheit, die Naturwunder Spitzbergens intensiv zu erkunden.

Die Spitzbergen Umrundung mit dem Expeditionsschiff QUEST wird bilingual, mit deutsch- und englischsprachiger Reiseleitung durchgeführt.

Tage 4 – 12: Expedition an Bord der QUEST

Wir planen für die kommenden Reisetage zahlreiche Anlandungen und Ausflüge mit den Zodiacs. Hier möchten wir Ihnen einige der möglichen Anlandungsplätze vorstellen.

Nordwest Spitzbergen

Die Ortschaft **Ny Ålesund** liegt am riesigen **Kongsfjorden.** Einstmals Standort für den Abbau von Kohle ist **Ny Ålesund** heute vor allem die Basis zahlreicher wissenschaftliche Forschungsprojekte zur Erforschung der Arktis. In **Ny Ålesund** wurde aber auch **Polargeschichte** geschrieben: Von hier begannen Amundsen und Nobile ihre heldenhaften Expeditionen zum Nordpol.

Zwei weitere mutige Versuche, den Nordpol zu erreichen, begannen auf der nördlich gelegenen Insel **Danskøya**. Der schwedische Entdecker Andrée machte einen Versuch mit einem Wasserstoffballon und der amerikanische Journalist Wellman startete mit einem Luftschiff. Hier finden sich bis heute interessante Überreste dieser Expeditionen.

Im **Krossfjord** bestaunen wir die wunderschöne Eisfront des **Gletschers vom 14. Juli.** Oft wird der Gletscher von großen Schwärmen von Dreizehenmöwen und Dickschnabellummen umkreist, die auf den nah gelegenen Klippen nisten.



Spektakuläre Landschaften in den Fjorden Nordspitzbergens

Spitzbergen bietet dem Besucher zahlreiche nordische Fjordlandschaften. Während dieser Reise planen wir zum Beispiel den **Liefdefjord** (den"Fjord der Liebe") zu erkunden. Dieser Fjord ist eingefasst von schneebedeckten Berggipfeln und wir planen den sich in den Fjord ergiessenden gewaltigen **Monaco-Gletscher** zu besuchen.

Die Landschaft am **Raudfjord** wird von mehreren wunderschönen Gletschern dominiert und gilt als beliebter Aufenthaltsort für Robben und verschiedene Seevogelarten. Wo Robben ihre Liegeplätze haben, muß auch immer mit dem Erscheinen eines **Eisbären** gerechnet werden.

Hinlopenstraße und Alkefjellet

Wenn es die Eisverhältnisse erlauben, laufen wir in die Hinlopenstraße ein.

Hier liegt das **Alkefjellet**, eine beeindruckende Basaltklippe, auf der über 100 000 **Dickschnabellummen** ihre Brutplätze haben. Eventuell fahren wir auch weiter in die **Palanderbukt** auf der riesigen Insel Nordaustlandet.



Südwest Spitzbergen

Der große **Hornsund** mit seinen zahlreichen Seitenfjorden bietet einmal mehr spektakuläre Landschaftsbilder. Zum Einen weil hier einige große Gletscher ihre Eismassen ins Meer entlassen, aber auch wegen der atemberaubenden "Skyline" von hohen Berggipfeln. An einem klaren Tag bietet sich hier die Aussicht auf den Gipfel des **Hornsundtind** – mit 1431 Metern der höchste Berg Spitzbergens. Der **Hornsund** ist auch ein beliebtes Jagdrevier für einige der Svalbard-**Eisbären** und auf dem Fjordeis sieht man oft deren Beutetiere – die großen **Bartrobben**.



Tag 13: Ende der Naturkreuzfahrt und Rückreise von Longyearbyen nach Oslo

Die QUEST wird heute wieder in den Hafen von Longyearbyen einlaufen und am frühen Morgen beginnt unsere **Ausschiffung**. Nun heißt es ,,Abschied nehmen von Spitzbergen". Sie treten die Rückreise an und fliegen zunächst zurück nach Oslo. Je nach Flugverbindung ist für Sie eine weitere Übernachtung in Oslo eingeplant (die Übernachtung ist im Programmpreis inkludiert).



Das Expeditionsteam der QUEST, bestehend aus wissenschaftlichen Lektoren und ortskundigen Reiseleitern, vermittelt Ihnen bei Vorträgen und Exkursionen Interessantes und Wissenswertes über Land und Leute sowie über die Fauna und Flora der Arktis.


Aufgrund ihres geringen Tiefgangs von nur 3,5 m kann die QUEST auch solche Buchten und Fjorde befahren, die für größere Kreuzfahrtschiffe unerreichbar sind.

Zur **Eisklasse** ist folgendes zu sagen: da es sich um einen Zweckbau für die grönländischen Küstengewässer handelt, wurde besonderer **Wert auf die passive Sicherheit durch einen sehr stabilen Rumpf** gelegt. Dieser wurde nach den Vorgaben der Eisklasse A1A konstruiert. Für die Gesamteisklasse ist aber auch die Maschinenleistung maßgeblich und die wurde – für die Küstenschifffahrt üblich – auf niedrigen Verbrauch optimiert. Daher ist die Gesamteisklasse "nur" bei A1B. Es handelt sich also um ein **sparsames Schiff** mit **äußerst stabilem Rumpf**!

Alle **26 Kabinen** sind **Außenkabinen** mit eigenem Bad und **Fenster**. In jeder Kabine findet sich ein Schreibtisch mit Stuhl und ein Schrank zur Aufbewahrung. Die Kabinen verfügen über ausreichend Staumöglichkeiten für Kleidung und Ausrüstung während der Reise. Stromanschluss in allen Kabinen: Euro-Stecker mit 220 V.



ITINERARY

Day 1: Longyearbyen, Svalbard

We arrive in Longyearbyen and transfer to our hotel.

Day 2 - 8: Expedition cruising

Explore Longyearbyen on your own before meeting up your fellow expedition members and guides for lunch. In the afternoon we board the expedition ship and sail out through Isfjorden - our Arctic expedition has started! We are now in a part of the world where we are completely dependent on the ice and weather conditions. Our exact itinerary depends on these factors and on the wildlife we encounter. Our aim is to head out on Zodiacs cruises every day and also to go ashore when the opportunity arises. Here are some examples of places we may visit:

Prins Karls Forland

This narrow strip of land is covered by a magnificent and snow-covered mountain chain. The island is also home to many seabirds and harbour seals.

Virgohamna, Danskøya

Danskøya was the starting point for two of the most daring attempts to reach the North Pole. The Swedish explorer Andrée made an attempt with a hydrogen balloon and American journalist Wellman started with an airship. Interesting remnants of these Arctic expeditions can still be seen here.

Fantastic fjords

Svalbard offers the visitor countless spectacular fjords. During our journey we will explore a some of them such as: Liefdefjorden, meaning "The fjord of love", is lined with snow-covered mountain peaks and here we hope to cruise along the face of the spectacular Monaco Glacier. Many common eiders and pink-footed geese nest in the area and if we are lucky we may see the rare king eider. In Krossfjorden we enjoy in the beautifully sculpted front of the 14th of July Glacier and are greeted by the large numbers of kittiwakes and Brünnich's guillemots nesting on the nearby cliffs. Raudfjorden is an area of immense natural beauty – dominated by magnificent glaciers. It is also a favourite spot of seals and the bird cliffs are abuzz with activity. Kongsfjorden is home to the scientific village of Ny-Ålesund. It was from here that Amundsen and Nobile set out on their heroic expeditions to the North Pole.

North Spitsbergen

North of Spitsbergen, we may come across the edge of the pack ice. Not many ships venture here and we can marvel at the silence and grandeur of this icy landscape. We keep an eye out for the iconic Arctic wildlife.

Southwest Spitsbergen

The grand fjords of Hornsund offer spectacular glaciers and a breathtaking landscape of towering mountain peaks, often rising above the clouds. On a clear day you can see the summit of the highest mountain, Hornsundtind, at 1431 metres. Hornsund is a favourite haunt of some of Svalbard's polar bears and bearded seals can often be seen resting on the fjord ice.



Day 9: Longyearbyen

Early morning we disembark our expedition ship and begin our journey back home.

Please note: All itineraries are for guidance only. Our exact route will depend on the ice, weather conditions, wildlife and government regulations. The places mentioned are just examples of some of the many sites Svalbard has to offer. We always strive to maximise your experience. Please remember that flexibility is the key to a successful expedition!





ITINERARY

Day 1: Longyearbyen, Svalbard

We arrive in Longyearbyen and transfer to our hotel.

Day 2 - 11: Expedition cruising

Explore Longyearbyen on your own before meeting up your fellow travellers and guides for lunch. In the afternoon we board the expedition ship and sail out through the spectacular Isfjorden - the Arctic expedition has started! We are now in a part of the world where we are completely dependent on the ice and weather conditions. Our exact itinerary will depend on these factors and on the wildlife we encounter. Our aim is to head out on Zodiac cruises every day and to go ashore when the opportunity arises. Here are some examples of places we may visit:

Northwest Spitsbergen

The scientific village of Ny-Ålesund is situated in Kongsfjorden. It was from here that Amundsen and Nobile started their heroic expeditions to the North Pole. Two other courageous attempts to reach the North Pole started on the island of Danskøya. The Swedish explorer Andrée made an attempt with a hydrogen balloon and the American journalist Wellman started with an airship. Interesting remnants of these expeditions can still be seen here.

Magnificent fjords

Svalbard offers the visitor countless spectacular fjords. During our journey we will explore a some of them such as: Liefdefjorden, meaning "The fjord of love", is lined with snow-covered mountain peaks and here we hope to cruise along the face of the spectacular Monaco Glacier. Many common eiders and pinkfooted geese nest in the area. In Krossfjorden we revel in the beautifully sculptured front of the 14th of July Glacier and are greeted by the many kittiwakes and Brünnich's guillemots that nest on the nearby cliffs. Raudfjorden is an area of immense natural beauty – dominated by magnificent glaciers. It is also a favourite haunt of seals and the bird cliffs are bursting with activity.

Hinlopen Strait and Alkefjellet

Ice conditions permitting, we enter Hinlopen Strait. Here we find Alkefjellet, an impressive basalt cliff that is home to an estimated 200 000 Brünnich's guillemots. We may also continue into the beautiful bay of Palanderbukta on Nordaustlandet.

Eastern Svalbard

The island of Nordaustlandet is covered by an huge ice cap and has fascinated naturalists and historians alike. Here the giant glacier Bråsvellbreen stretches for 180 kilometres! The 15-20 metre high ice edge is punctuated by hundreds of by hundreds of waterfalls. Barentsøya and Edgeøya offer magnificent landscapes and vast tundra. There is a good chance of seeing walrus, arctic fox and Svalbard reindeer.

Southwest Spitsbergen

The grand fjords of Hornsund offer spectacular glaciers and a breathtaking landscape of towering mountain peaks, often reaching above the clouds. On a clear day we can see the summit of the highest mountain, Hornsundtind, at 1431 meters.

Day 12: Longyearbyen

Early morning we disembark our expedition ship and begin our journey back home.





The ship was built in Denmark in 1992 to serve as a ferry on Greenland's west coast. In 2004/2005 she was completely refurbished into a comfortable expedition ship and in 2018 she underwent a renovation of the passenger areas. *M/S Quest* takes 53 passengers and all 26 cabins are outside cabins with private facilities. The triple cabins have upper and lower berths. All other cabins have two lower berths or a double bed. In your cabin you find a desk with a chair and a cupboard for storage. The superior cabins are spacious and have armchairs and TV. The owner's cabin has a double bed, two large picture windows, a separate seating area and TV. In the dining room you are treated to delicious meals in between landings and in the panorama lounge you can enjoy breath-taking views of the surrounding landscape. Here you can listen to entertaining talks on the area's flora, fauna and history. In the lounge you also find a bar and a small library. The ship has spacious observation decks, where you can enjoy the beautiful vistas. Passengers are welcome on the bridge around the clock and there is always something to see or search for. You are welcomed by an international crew and the atmosphere is relaxed and very friendly. There are five Zodiacs and five guides on board *M/S Quest*.

LOUNGE & BAR



In the panorama lounge on deck five you can enjoy breathtaking views of the surrounding landscape. Here you can listen to interesting talk on the area's flora, fauna and history. Slideshows are presented on two 60 inch TV-screens. In the lounge you also find a bar and a small library with fact books, novels, board games and DVDs. Coffee, tea and cookies are available around the clock. From the panorama lounge you can also access the outdoor top observation deck.

RESTAURANT



The dining room is found in the aft on deck 2. Here you are treated to delicious meals in between landings. It is comfortable and spacious enough to accommodate all passengers and expedition staff in one seating and the portholes offers a nice sea view.

The breakfast and lunch are buffet style and the dinner is a combination of starters and salad buffet and served main course and desserts. The meals offer choice of fish, meat, pasta and vegetarian.

LANDINGS & EXCURSIONS



The ship has five Zodiacs, perfect for landings and shuttling. With these safe and sturdy rubber boats we navigate among icebergs, cruise along glaciers and go ashore to get unique nature experiences.

The solution for getting in and out of the Zodiac is superb. Through a hatch in the hull you just take one step and you are in the Zodiac.

For Zodiac operations M/S Quest is equipped with horseshoe style life jackets. All jackets have both manual and automatic inflation.

SAFETY

M/S Quest exceeds all SOLAS-requirements (Safety Of Life At Sea) and is equipped with the latest communication- and navigation equipment

LIFE BOATS & LIFE RAFTS



M/S Quest has a total life boat and raft capacity of 160 passengers. It consists of two life boats with space for 45 passengers in each and 2 life rafts with space for 35 passengers in each. The boats and rafts are equipped with drinking water, survival equipment and survival food rations and sea-sickness pills. The diesel powered boats are also equipped with navigational equipment, medication, and communication equipment.

LIFE SAVING EQUIPMENT

For emergency situations *M/S Quest* has an overcapacity of life vests and the highest grade of Immersion Suits.

FIRE SAFETY

The ship is equipped with automatic smoke detectors, a sprinkler system and fire safety doors. Fire alarms and fire extinguishers are placed around the ship.

COMMUNICATION

For passenger use *M/S Quest* can offer an on board e-mail account charged by a set up fee and a data transmission rate. This e-mail account can be accessed from the passengers own laptop via a wireless network from almost anywhere on the ship. The passengers can also buy phone cards for the satellite phone available in the lobby on deck 4.

ENVIRONMENTAL PROCEDURES

The tap water is drinkable and of high quality. All fresh water is produced on board from sea water. The system is oversized and the purified and desalinated water is stored in buffer tanks in case the purification system should fail.

All sewage is taken care of on board the ship. The three stage cleaning system is based on the latest technology and before the sewage is released into the sea it's completely decontaminated. The remaining waste products are emptied and taken care of by special vehicles or ships when the ship is in port.

All rubbish created on board is sorted and whatever is recyclable is handed over for recycling while in port after each expedition.

For the laundry they uses organic detergent and in the shower there are organic protera body wash, shampoo/ conditioner and body lotion.


OBSERVATION DECKS



The ship's two observation decks are located on deck 5 (exit from the Panorama lounge) and in front of the bridge on deck four (access via the passage on both sides of the Bridge). In addition, there is also access to outer deck 4. From the observation decks and deck four you can comfortably and safely observe the wildlife and enjoy the magnificent scenery. During certain weather conditions and situations the outer decks might be closed for safety reasons.

CABINS

All cabins are en suite, located on the outside and have large sea view windows. Windows on deck 4 can be opened. All cabins are equipped with separate air flow and temperature adjustment capabilities, hairdryers, personal safety box, 1 writing desk, 1 chair, 1 large mirror, 1 or more wardrobes with hangers, 4 big hooks for outer wear, 1 European 2-prong electrical outlet, 1 waste paper basket and 1 Marshall speaker.

All cabins are en suite and in the bathrooms you find a safety handrail, shower, mirror, 2 cupboards, 2 towel hangers, 3 button style hooks, retractable clothes line, soap cup in shower, electrical outlet for razor. To enter the bathrooms there is a step over a high threshold.





ITINERARY

With our sturdy Zodiacs we explore this winter wonderland, heading for some of Svalbard's most magnificent fjords. We also try to go ashore whenever the ice and snow allow.

Day 1: Longyearbyen, Svalbard

We arrive in Longyearbyen and transfer to our hotel.

Day 2 - 8: Expedition cruising

We start our Svalbard adventure by exploring Longyearbyen. In the afternoon we embark our expedition ship M/S Quest and head out through Isfjorden - our Arctic adventure has started! We are now in a part of the world where we are completely dependent on the ice and weather conditions. Our exact itinerary will depend on these factors and on the wildlife we encounter. We may make a first excursion before heading south or north, depending on the weather and ice conditions. Here are some examples of places we may visit:

Alkhornet

At the entrance of Isfjorden is the characteristic cliff of Alkhornet. We go ashore to enjoy the beautiful tundra and its birdlife, including barnacle geese, Brünnich's guillemots, glaucous gulls, snow buntings and tens of thousands of kittiwakes. Arctic foxes are sometimes seen in the rock crevices around the mountain and with a bit of luck we might see these lovely little animals scurrying around, frantically looking for food.

Prins Karls Forland

This narrow strip of land is covered by a magnificent and snow-covered mountain chain. The island is also home to many seabirds and harbour seals

Kongsfjorden and Krossfjorden

The scientific village of Ny-Ålesund is located in Kongsfjorden. It was from here that Amundsen and Nobile started their heroic expeditions to the North Pole. In the nearby Krossfjorden we can admire the beautifully sculpted front of the 14th of July Glacier and listen to the sounds of the many kittiwakes and Brünnich's guillemots that nest on the nearby cliffs.

Raudfjorden

Raudfjorden is an area of immense natural beauty – dominated by magnificent glaciers. It is also a favourite haunt of seals, and the bird cliffs are bursting with activity.

Virgohamna, Danskøya

Danskøya was the starting point for two of the most daring attempts to reach the North Pole. The Swedish explorer Andrée made an attempt with a hydrogen balloon and American journalist Wellman started with an airship. Interesting remnants of these Arctic expeditions can still be seen here.

Bellsund

At the beautiful Vårsolbukta in Bellsund little auks nest by the tens of thousands. We go ashore and walk across the tundra to get a closer look at these charming birds.



Hornsund

The majestic Hornsund consists of several magnificent fjords along the west coast of Spitsbergen, where huge glaciers calve out shimmering blue ice. This is one of the favourite haunts of some of Svalbard's polar bears, and we may be lucky enough to spot one on the fjord ice.

Day 9: Longyearbyen

In the morning we leave the ship in Longyearbyen and begin our journey home.

Please note: All itineraries are for guidance only. Our exact route will depend on the ice, weather conditions, wildlife and government regulations. The places mentioned are just examples of some of the many sites Svalbard has to offer. We always strive to maximise your experience. Please remember that flexibility is the key to a successful expedition!

Snowshoeing





Danskøya was the starting point for two of the most daring attempts to reach the North Pole. The Swedish explorer Andrée made an attempt with a hydrogen balloon and the American journalist Wellman started with an airship. Interesting remnants of these Arctic expeditions can still be seen here.

Fantastic fjords

Svalbard offers the visitor countless spectacular fjords. During our cruise we will explore some of them such as: Liefdefjorden, meaning "The fjord of love", is lined with snow-capped mountain peaks and here we hope to cruise along the face of the spectacular Monaco Glacier. Many common eiders and pink-footed geese nest in the area and if we are lucky we may see the rare king eider. In Krossfjorden we enjoy in the beautifully sculpted front of the 14th of July Glacier and are greeted by the large numbers of kittiwakes and Brünnich's guillemots nesting on the nearby cliffs. Raudfjorden is an area of immense natural beauty – dominated by magnificent glaciers. It is also a favourite spot of seals and the bird cliffs are abuzz with activity. Kongsfjorden is home to the scientific village of Ny-Ålesund. It was from here that Amundsen and Nobile set out on their heroic expeditions to the North Pole.

Fantastic fjords

Svalbard offers the visitor countless spectacular fjords. During our journey we will explore a few of them such as: Liefdefjorden, meaning "The fjord of love", is lined with snow-covered mountain peaks and here we hope to cruise along the face of the spectacular Monaco Glacier. Many common eiders and pinkfooted geese nest in the area and if lucky we could see the rare king eider. In Krossfjorden we revel in the beautifully sculptured front of the 14th of July Glacier to the raucous greeting of the large number of kittiwakes and Brünnich's guillemots nesting on the nearby cliffs. Raudfjorden is an area of immense natural beauty – dominated by beautiful glaciers. It is also a favourite spot for seals and the bird cliffs are bursting with activity. The scientific village of Ny-Ålesund is situated in Kongsfjorden. It was from here that Amundsen and Nobile started their heroic expeditions to the North Pole.

ITINERARY

Day 1: Bergen

The great journey begins in the city of Bergen, beautifully surrounded by high mountains and deep fjords. We stay the night at a centrally located hotel.

Day 2-9: Northern Norway

Ålesund

Grip

Torghatten

On our way north we sail past famous natural attractions like the mountain peaks known as the Seven Sisters, followed by Torghatten -a rock with a big hole, that the ice sheet once created, or according to the legend; the hole a giant created in despair from a broken heart.

Kerringøy

Kjerringøy is a real gem on the Norwegian coast. Here we encounter a diverse landscape of mountains, white sandy beaches and small farming communities, but the island is most famous for its old trading post. This is a unique heritage consisting of 15 well-preserved houses, which gives the visitor a great insight into what it was like to live in this northern trading town in the 1800s.

Reine

We hope to visit the picturesque fishing village of Reine. This charming village, with characteristic wooden houses overlook Kirkefjord with high mountain tops in the background. It is not difficult to see why it was once voted Norway's most beautiful place.

Nusfjord

Nusfjord is a well-preserved and authentic fishing community with focus on cod fishing. The village is part of UNESCO's World Heritage list of unique wooden houses with a charming old fashioned shop well worth a visit. We sail further along what is known as the Lofoten wall. In the evening we enter magical Trollfjorden and later set course towards Tromsø.



Tromsø

In Tromsø we visit the prestigious Polar Museum and learn more about the first polar explorers, who went north to seek fame and fortune. The city is known as Paris of the North, which derives from its vast cultural offerings.

Day 10: At sea

We set sail towards the remote Bear Island, situated in the middle of the Barents Sea. (The exact day of the crossing can change and is depending on the weather.)

Day 11 - 16: Bear Island & Svalbard

On the 400-meter high cliffs of Bear Island, hundreds of thousands of seabirds are nesting – puffins, guillemots, razorbills and kittiwakes among others. If wind and weather allows, we aim to do a spectacular Zodiac cruise along the impressive bird cliffs and set foot on this rarely visited island.

We then continue our journey and sail over night. Our next destination is Svalbard – one of the world's most magnificent wildernesses. It is spring in the Arctic and it is a powerfulexperience to witness the archipelago spring to life. We enjoy the stunning nature that surrounds us – sparkling ice formations, snow covered mountains and glistering glaciers. We start by exploring parts of Storfjorden and constantly keeping our eyes peeled for the Arctic wildlife. How far in we reach depends on the drift ice that often accumulates here this time of year. We continue towards majestic Hornsund, consisting of several fjords, which glaciers calve out shimmering blue icebergs. It is also a favourite haunt for polar bears. In Bellsund we hope to reach Vårsolbukta, where the little auks nest in tens of thousands.

Day 17: Longyearbyen

We disembark in Longyearbyen and begin our journey home.
