4 You'll feel like family. We hear this all the time from departing passengers, and we love it. On board, you're not just a passenger, you're a fellow explorer. Your dinner tablemates might be expedition leaders, photography coaches, our whale-tracking partners from Woods Hole, or even our President, who still travels with us several times a year. By the end of your journey, you'll know us by name, and you may even make some new friends for life.

5 Our staff is better than just great; they're engaging. We believe our staff, top to bottom, is the most experienced, most skilled team in Antarctica. But we also hire for the things that don't appear on most resumes. A passion for exploration. A desire to be part of a team. Fun to be around. And a love for passing their love of this incredible place on to everyone around them. When an expedition team is out of sync (and it happens) it's not just bad for them, it's bad for you, too.





The Polar Latitudes S.H.I.E.L.D.



We understand that even as the world opens up, health remains a lingering concern and therefore for us, it will continue to be a major priority. To ensure the safety of everyone on board – while maximizing your once-in-a-lifetime Antarctic experience – we will be instituting what we're calling The Polar Latitudes S.H.I.E.L.D., a deep and multifaceted program developed by our team of medical and operations specialists, with guidance from the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the World Health Organization (WHO). Here's what our S.H.I.E.L.D. currently entails, though some details may change.

S – Science-Based. All our policies and procedures, from predeparture to disembarkation, are made with the guidance of the best currently available medical and scientific information from around the globe. Should the data and science evolve, so too will our protocols.

H – Health and Safety First. Every decision we've made and will continue to make, places the health and safety of our entire PL family as number one. All crew members, from captain to kitchen staff, will be trained on the latest Covid safety protocols.

I – Immunizations. Everyone on board must be fully vaccinated with documentation issued by the vaccinating authority. Seasonal flu shots are also recommended, to avoid any confusion regarding symptoms.

E – Evaluating and Testing. Every traveler must provide documentation of a recent negative Covid test before joining the group, and travelers will be re-tested upon arrival at our hotel. If deemed necessary, a third test may be administered upon boarding.

L – Layers of Protection On Board. Upgraded ventilation systems will provide circulating fresh air in each cabin, and all other onboard spaces will be sanitized nightly. The layout and passenger capacity of Seaventure allows for easy social distancing, and hand sanitizer stations will always be within easy reach.

D – Dedicated to Your Experience. The Polar Latitudes S.H.I.E.L.D. is designed to keep you safe and put your mind at ease, while making only the slightest – and hardly noticeable – program changes. Once we set out for Antarctica, rest assured your entire focus will turn to the penguins, whales, spectacular panoramic vistas and, of course, that very first iceberg sighting.



Should Antarctica's unpredictable weather and ice permit, you will be among the lucky few to cross the Antarctic Circle, where the sun remains in the sky for 20 hours a day. Following a tradition first established by sailors crossing the equator, we'll celebrate the occasion before heading onward toward any number of historic and rarely visited British Survey bases, after which we turn back north.

Day 9-11, Antarctic Peninsula:

Heading north into warmer climes, we'll see less sea ice and more open channels, offering access to islands where we can anticipate any number of wildlife sightings, which could include a variety of seal species, as well as penguin rookeries where the locals will be taking advantage of the rocky shore to build their nesting sites. You can anticipate more whale sightings, as well, as Humpbacks feast on the plentiful krill in these warmer waters. As always, we will seek out opportunities to stop at several active scientific bases and historic landing sites along the way, as we leave no opportunity unseized-upon in our quest to explore the very best of this magical place.

BUENOS AIRES



Day 1, Arrive in Ushuaia

After a friendly welcome at the airport and a transfer to the luxurious Arakur Resort & Spa, take some time to unwind or explore the southernmost city in the world, Ushuaia. Our evening briefing at the Arakur is your opportunity to ask questions and meet some of your fellow explorers.

Day 2, All Aboard Seaventure!

Spend your morning relaxing at the hotel, visiting a museum, or exploring the shops in Ushuaia, before our mid-afternoon escort to the ship. Our Expedition Team and ship staff will welcome you on board and get you settled in, followed by a safety and orientation briefing and our Captain's welcome dinner. We're on our way to Antarctica!

Day 3, Southern Ocean

As we sail south, important briefings on environmental regulations and expedition safety are held, and you won't want to miss our scientific and environmental experts as they begin their deeply knowledgeable, and always entertaining talks about the wildlife, history, and geology of the areas we will soon be exploring.

Day 4, West Falklands/Malvinas

We'll be exploring some of the westernmost settled outposts in the Falklands/Malvinas, a remote South Atlantic archipelago renowned for its rugged terrain and cliff-lined coast. As we stretch our legs along the farmland and beaches, we'll have an opportunity to visit Albatross and penguin colonies. Look for Rockhopper, King and Magellanic penguin rookeries.

Day 5, Stanley, East Falklands/Malvinas

The archipelago's largest island, Stanley, is a lively hub of activity nestled in a sheltered harbor. Here, the Falklands Islands Museum has fascinating exhibits devoted to maritime exploration, natural history and the 1982 Falklands War. We'll likely visit Gypsy Cove, part of Cape Pembroke peninsula, a National Nature Preserve. Magellanic penguins, also known as Jackass penguins for the braying sound they make, breed here, nesting in underground burrows. Other native bird species include Black-Crowned Night herons, Long-Tailed meadowlarks, Two-Banded plovers, and Upland and Kelp geese. Nearby Ordinance Point is the final resting place for several World War II guns.

Day 6-7, Southern Ocean

Things continue ramping up with plenty of birdlife sightings as we make our way east across the Antarctic Convergence and officially enter Antarctic waters. See if you can identify the world's largest bird, the Wandering albatross. From soaring giants like the Southern Giant petrel to the tiny Wilson's Storm petrels, a range of impressive bird species will be hitching a ride on the updrafts created by ocean swells and waves. And be on the lookout for whale blows and our very first iceberg sighting.



Day 8-11, South Georgia

South Georgia is often referred to as the 'Serengeti of the Southern Ocean' and it's easy to see why as you take in tens of millions (not a typo!) of breeding penguins, seals, and seabirds. Breathtaking mountain scenery, majestically sculpted icebergs, glaciers in every direction, and a rich historical tapestry are all here to complement the incredible array of wildlife on view as we travel down South Georgia's leeward coast. We'll also visit historic Grytviken whaling station, featuring the tiny graveyard where the great Antarctic explorer Sir Ernest Shackleton is buried.

Day 12-13, Scotia Sea

Heading farther south, we'll continue our informative presentations and wildlife spotting as the icebergs become bigger and more plentiful.

Day 14-17, Antarctic Peninsula and South Shetland Islands

Welcome to Antarctica in all its awe-inspiring glory. For the next few days, we'll explore any number of picturesque bays and famed harbors, maneuvering through majestic channels, where glorious icebergs and an array of beguiling wildlife share the highly active waters. Prepare to be amazed as we spot numerous species of penguins, seals, and whales, both along the rugged coastline as well as in the sea. There are great opportunities to stop at several active scientific bases and historic landing sites, and we plan to take full advantage of all the continent offers.



We chart a course through the Drake Passage and along the Antarctic Peninsula with the ambition of being among the few to cross the Antarctic Circle. The farther south we go, the more dramatic sea ice we are likely to encounter, along with incredible wildlife and awe-inspiring scenery. Should we arrive at 66°33'S, we'll join the small band of Antarctic explorers that can claim they have made it this far south. Celebration ensues!

Day 1, Arrive in Ushuaia

After a friendly welcome at the airport and a transfer to the luxurious Arakur Resort & Spa, take some time to unwind or explore the southernmost city in the world, Ushuaia. Our evening briefing at the Arakur is your opportunity to ask questions and meet some of your fellow explorers.

Day 2, All Aboard Seaventure!

Spend your morning relaxing at the hotel, visiting a museum, or exploring the shops in Ushuaia, before our mid-afternoon escort to the ship. Our Expedition Team and ship staff will welcome you on board and get you settled in, followed by a safety and orientation briefing and our Captain's welcome dinner. We're on our way to Antarctica!

Day 3-4, Drake Passage

Join our Polar Experts as they share their vast knowledge of Antarctica, from its enchanting wildlife to its bold history. Participate in our pioneering Citizen Science program or sit back and take in this fabled journey while catching glimpses of rarely seen wildlife. Keep your binoculars handy to identify the many seabirds that escort our ship as we cross the Antarctic Convergence into Antarctica's waters and noticeably cooler temperatures.

Day 5, South Shetland Islands:

The South Shetlands are 12 islands separated from the Antarctic Peninsula by The Bransfield Strait. Significant volcanic activity has sculpted a geology – and a diverse natural beauty – unlike anywhere else on earth. Here, you can expect a spectacular display of mountains, glaciers, and wildlife including Chinstrap and Gentoo penguins; and it's not uncommon to share the water's edge with Elephant and Fur seals. And this time of year is feeding time for Humpback whales, so don't be surprised if you're joined by a number of them on your day's adventure.

Day 6-8, Antarctica Awaits:

On to the Antarctic Peninsula, where we'll explore any number of stunning bays and famed harbors, maneuvering through majestic channels as we continue to travel these wildlife-rich waters, passing a number of glorious icebergs along the way. We'll have great opportunities to stop at several active scientific bases and historic landing sites as we direct our attention and our cameras toward numerous species of penguins, seals, and whales along the rugged coastlines and in the sea. As always throughout this journey, be on the lookout for the impressive population of Humpback, Minke and Orca whales feeding in the water.

Day 9-10, Drake Passage:

We leave this magical place and make our way north, once again crossing the legendary Drake Passage. We have one last hurrah as we celebrate the conclusion of our expedition with a special slideshow and a final meal together.

From minimizing fuel consumption per passenger, to updating our waste management systems to the highest standards possible, to the tiniest details like issuing every passenger a reusable water bottle, we are committed to protecting the last wild place on earth, and inspiring others to do the same.



Polar Latitudes Citizen Science Program

Citizen Science is a way to harness the power of travelers to observe, record, and report on natural phenomena. This is particularly helpful in the Antarctic, where it is challenging to support long-term academic observation teams.

Guests on Polar Latitudes voyages are invited to participate in data-gathering activities that support major research projects. The data we collect contributes to a better understanding of Antarctica's unique ecology and changing climate.

Our new ship Seaventure will boast a brand new science lab! The lab will serve as a home base to visiting scientists on board and enhance participation in our citizen science programs.

The projects offered may vary slightly by voyage. If you are interested in participating please see the onboard daily bulletin and join the scheduled Citizen Science Introduction Meeting at the start of your voyage. There is no additional cost to participate.

SEABIRD SURVEYS

Providing data for Stony Brook University

We complete at-sea and on-shore bird surveys for Stoney Brook University to study the distribution, population status, and breeding events of birds in the Southern Ocean and along the Antarctic Peninsula.

CLOUD OBSERVATIONS

Providing data for NASA Globe Observer

By observing and recording cloud cover & type timed to NASA satellite fly-overs, we can help scientists understand how surface and air temperature are affected by cloud cover, and how clouds will respond to a changing climate as well.



Water Sampling for the Scripps Institution of Oceanography



SALP PROJECT

Providing data for Alfred Wegener Institute

Salp are free-swimming invertebrates that feed on phytoplankton. We will collect baseline data of Salp distribution around our landing sites and also collect a few specimens for genetic species determination. There has been a recent increase in Salp abundance on a circumpolar scale around Antarctica. The data we collect will help scientists of the Alfred Wegener Institute explore how this might be linked to a changing climate.

SOUTHERN OCEAN WATER SAMPLING

Providing data for the Scripps Institution of Oceanography

We will be measuring the surface water temperature and salinity during sea days on crossings between Ushuaia and the Peninsula, as well as between South Georgia and the Peninsula for the Scripps Institution of Oceanography. The data we collect contributes to a study of the long-term temperature and salinity trends of the Southern Ocean.

FJORDPHYTO – PHYTOPLANKTON

Providing data for the Scripps Institution of Oceanography

By collecting phytoplankton samples in fjord systems along the Antarctic Peninsula, we help scientists at the Scripps Institution of Oceanography obtain a seasonal picture of phytoplankton abundance, composition, and distribution throughout the growth season (from October to March), as well as how phytoplankton are influenced by (increasing) melt-water inflow from glaciers.

MARINE MAMMAL IDENTIFICATION

Providing data for Happy Whale

We photograph unique identifiable markings on a whale's fluke (tail) and dorsal fin, which allows Happy Whale to non-invasively track whale movements over time. By focusing on whales, we bring attention to the marine ecosystem as a whole and the challenges we face as a global community.

Presentations and briefings will help you better understand your camera, learn a few tricks of the trade, and better master the day's unpredictable weather and environment. Your coach is with you in the field — sometimes accompanying you in a Zodiac, with you on a shore landing, or sitting at the table next to you at dinner, ready and willing to answer any question, or pass along an inside tip earned through years of experience in Antarctic waters. Don't hesitate to ask!






The Antarctic Shackleton Challenge with Lou Rudd




